Talk for Writing Text: Dear Zoo, by Rod Campbell

Literacy

- To learn the story 'The Three Billy Goats Gruff'.
- To draw characters from the story.
- To retell the story through role play and our own words.

How to help your child at home:

- Retell the story with your child.
- Practise drawing pictures of new trolls and goats.

Personal Social & Emotional

- Encouraging independence through taking turns and sharing.

How to help your child at home:

- Encourage your child to dress and undress themselves.
- Play games that encourage turn taking and sharing.

Maths

- To practise adding 1 more or 1 less than a given number.
- Preposition – To describe the position of objects eg, on top, under next to.
- Name and describe 2D shapes.

How to help your child at home:

- To look for shapes in the environment.
- Make repeating patterns using things around the home.

Communication & Language

- Use descriptive language to describe characters from 'The Three Billy Goats Gruff'.
- Use prepositional language.

How to help at home:

- Name body parts.
- Encourage your child to speak in full sentences.

Understanding the World

- To look at different types of buildings and structures e.g. bridges and houses etc.

How to help your child at home:

- To look for different types of buildings in the local environment such as houses, flats, bridges etc.

Physical Development

- To practise different skills on large apparatus.

How to help your child at home:

- Talk your child to the park and encourage them to climb, balance and play on the different equipment.

Expressive Arts & Design

- Paint characters from the story.
- Make bridges from construction materials.

How to help at home:

- Encourage your child to make models from construction materials.
- To practise painting, cutting, sticking and drawing.
