



Literacy

- To learn the story 'Mr Grumpy's Outing'.
- To practise writing stories.
- To write a recount about something we have done.

How to help your child at home:

- Ask your child to retell the story.
- Talk to your child about the farm trip and the animals that they saw.

Maths

- To practise subtraction.
- To order numbers to 20.
- To count forwards and backwards from a given number.
- To use positional language when describing the position of an object.

How to help your child at home:

- Count backwards from 10 or 20.
- Practise taking away a 1 digit number from another 1 digit number eg, $7 - 4 =$
- Talk about where things are positioned eg, on top, underneath etc.

Communication & Language

- Retell the story 'Mr Grumpy's Outing' using story language.
- Talk about holidays and where they have visited.
- Recount the farm trip.

How to help at home:

- Ask your child questions about the trip to 'Ash End Farm' and encourage them to answer questions using full sentences.

Personal Social & Emotional

- Talk about transition to year 1.
- Talk about different feelings.
- Continue knowing our rights.

How to help your child at home:

- Talk to your child about the new classrooms and teachers.

Understanding the World

- Floating and sinking.
- To learn about different places including Ash End Farm.

How to help your child at home:

- Go out and visit different places.
- Talk about the farm and the animals that were seen.

Physical Development

- To talk about ways to keep ourselves healthy.
- Learning new skills in sports.

How to help your child at home:

- Encourage healthy choices of food and drink.
- Play in the park.

Expressive Arts & Design

- Painting places.
- Making flags and postcards.
- To listen to music from different countries.

How to help at home:

- Practise making animal puppets.
- Draw pictures of different places.
