# Medical Tracker

On Monday, 24th February, we will be launching Medical Tracker. Instead of the paper First Aid slips, you will be getting an immediate email. Please refer to the chart below for details on how it will be used.

<b>Category 1</b>	Phone call home and an email via Medical Tracker	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Injury to mouth, face or head that leaves a mark or breaks the skin</li><li>• Injury to the groin area</li><li>• Any injury that is clearly visible and likely to cause concern.</li><li>• Stings with a severe reaction</li></ul>
<b>Category 2</b>	An email from Medical Tracker	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• All head/face injuries</li><li>• All bumps to the head.</li><li>• Large grazes</li><li>• Any injury caused by another child (i.e. bite, scratch that breaks the skin)</li><li>• Any graze that we are unable to remove the grit from</li><li>• Stings with a mild reaction</li><li>• Splinters</li></ul>
<b>Category 3</b>	Care and support given in school. Not reported via Medical Tracker.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• No visible mark and the child seems their usual self</li><li>• Minor cuts/grazes</li><li>• Minor bumps to any part of the body other than the head that leave no mark</li></ul>
