Leave in Term Time – Information about Fixed Penalty Notices.

During the Autumn Term, the parents of 17 children have either received or will soon receive a 'Fixed Term Penalty' for taking their children out of school without authorisation. How much are the fines?

Fines are £60 per child, per parent. If it has not been paid within 28 days, it rises to £120 per child, per parent. After 28 days of non-payment, the Local Authority will prosecute parents through the courts, after which the fine increases significantly.

It is the Local Authority who fine parents and school does not get any of this money unfortunately!

- Do you know where to go for help?




## Curriculum
