- Provide a reason for absence: please provide a brief explanation for the absence, such as illness
 or family emergency, to help us maintain accurate records.

Exciting news!


This term, all children will be participating in 6 weekly workshops led by Charis McRoberts, an actor, writer and practitioner from the Birmingham REP.

We have been awarded a £10,000 'Restore the Music' grant and have used this to purchase an amazing assortment of high-quality musical instruments. Children will be able to go into the MAC for their weekly music lessons and art lessons.

Educational Visits

We have carefully planned a range of educational visits across the school year for all year groups. These trips fit in with our curriculum and link to specific areas, such as history, geography or science. They also provide memorable experiences for our children and are a great way for socialising together.
