How to help your child at home:

Encourage your child to mark-make for pleasure. Provide old envelopes and receipts or notebooks and pens. Encourage them to have a go at reading and writing simple words.

Personal Social & Emotional

- Discuss relationships- manners, sharing and taking turns.
- Consider how to manage our feelings.

How to help your child at home:

- Help your child to recognise and name their feelings.
- Help your child to find positive ways to manage their feelings.

<u>Maths</u>

- Time
- 3d shapes
- pattern

How to help your child at home:

- Help your child to deepen their knowledge of numbers to 6 by counting objects and recognising patterns (e.g. we need five forks for dinner, I already have two so how many more do we need?)
- Help your child to develop their concept of time and order by discussing things happening throughout the day (now, next, first, last) and the days of the week.

Communication & Language

- Talking about stories and developing story vocabularyauthor, illustrator, publisher, front cover, blurb.
- Story times to develop new vocabulary, share ideas and ask and answer questions.

How to help at home:

• Help children to develop their vocabulary by talking to them about their school day and what they have been learning about.

- How are bridges made?
- Comparing modern and traditional stories
