- What words can you rhyme with shell, fish, sand and sea?






Book Recommendation

Expressive Art and Design

- Paint or draw a picture of a seaside. Look at photos on internet.
- Do you have any shells/stones?
 You could make a pattern with them.

Seaside

These activities are cross-curricular. That means they will support learning in other areas including the Prime areas; Communication and Language, Personal, Social and Emotional and Physical Development. Encourage your child to make their own suggestions, develop and change their own ideas and find ways of solving problems they encounter. This supports the development of the Characteristics of Effective Learning.

Maths

Ice cream maths with pom-poms, small cherry tomatoes or grapes.

Cut out some ice cream cone shapes from paper & write a number on each one. Give the children some kitchen tongs to move the pompoms, tomatoes or grapes to make ice cream scoops on top. Extend by adding 1 or 2 more scoops and saying the total or adding 2 ice creams together.
