Maths


- Use lots of different sized containers in the bath or paddling pool to fill and pour. Can you make the container full and empty? Which container holds more/less? How do you know?

Phonics

- Sound talk simple objects from the around the home e.g. c-u-p, h-a-t. Can you find the object? Encourage children to say the letter sounds back to you.
- Play 'I spy' encouraging children to hear the initial letter sound in words.

Understanding of the World

- Collect some household objects.
 Use the bath or sink to explore which ones float or sink.
- Try the skittles and water experiment. Talk about the changes that occur.
