Expressive Art and Design

- Build a castle! A Lego or Duplo castle, a box model castle, a wooden castle or sofa, cushion and blanket castle.

Understanding of the World

- Have a look at photos of our Royal family and talk about what they do? Where they live? What they wear for special occasions e.g. crowns, tiaras, gowns, robes?
