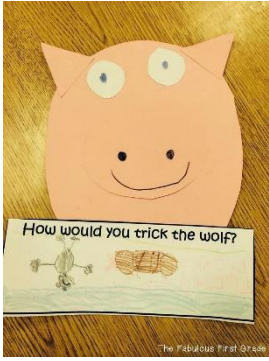


The Three Little Pigs Week 3

Make a sign for your recycling bin that says thank you for recycling your rubbish.

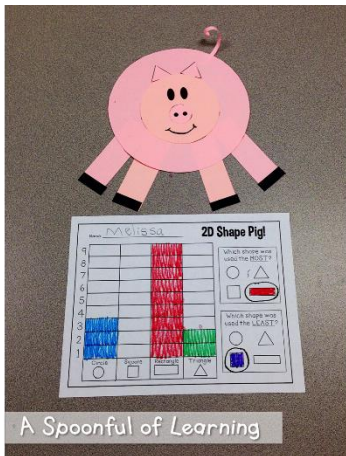


Play a game to practise your numbers.

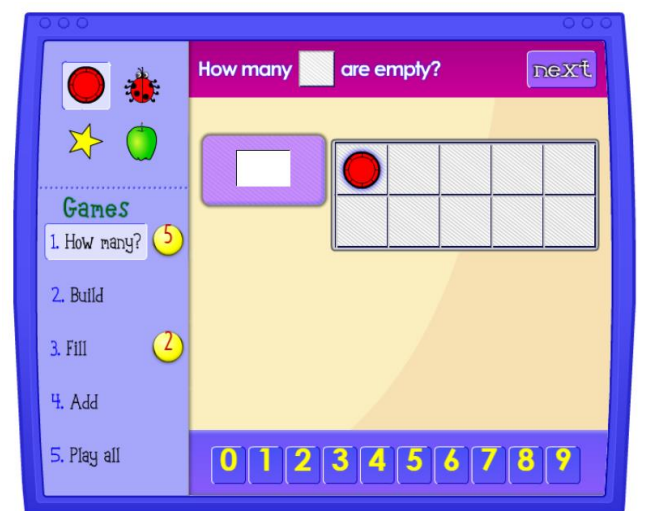


Make a shape pig and then see which shape you used the most.



Make some number sentences with stones.

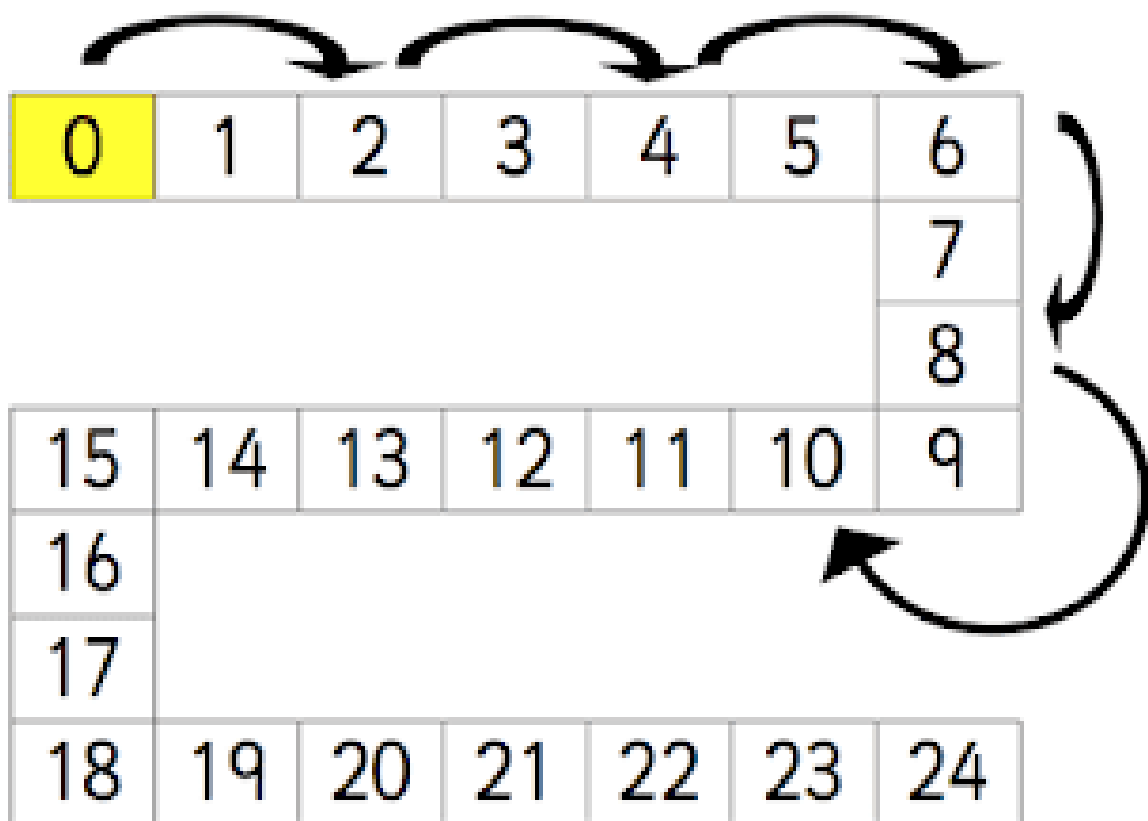

Counting in twos

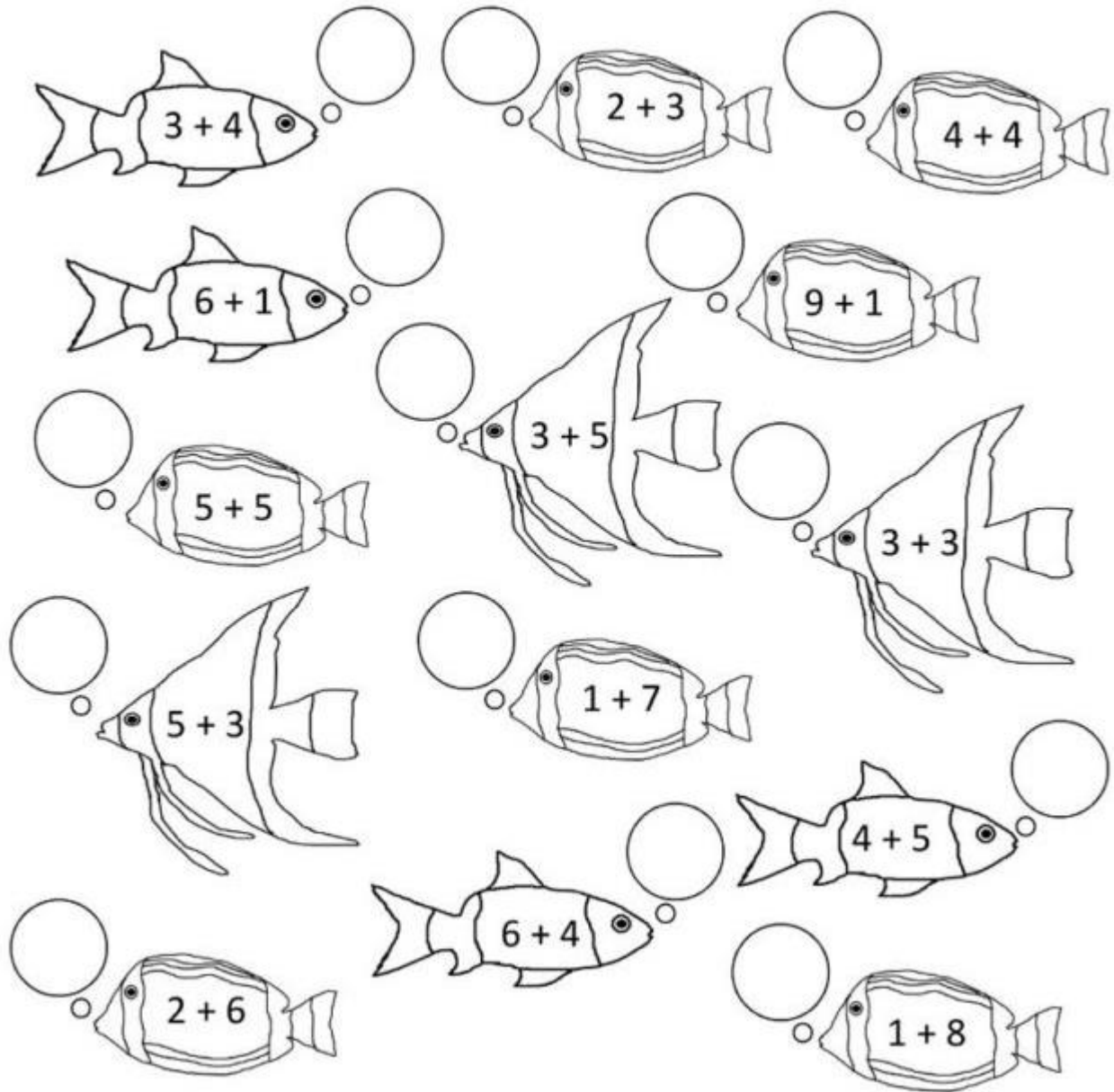


Start at 0.
