Attendance

Article 28 (Right to Education) your child has the right to a good quality education. You should encourage your child to go to school to the highest level they can. Medical appointment must be arranged outside of school hours. Medical evidence consists of appointment cards, screen shot of patient notes, prescriptions, and hospital/dental appointment letter. We will not ask for a doctor note so please do not request one on our behalf.
