Green 5 have also begun their work with the Wonderland Trust and Yorkshire Tea on the importance of trees and have sent letters to our partner school in Kenya who are also learning why trees are important to them. Green 5 and the Kenyan school will exchange letters and project work throughout the rest of the school year.
