#### Term Time Leave

##### **The law on requesting leave during term time:-**

If you wish to request term time leave for your child, you must make an application to Mrs. Williams two weeks before the planned absence. This will only be authorised if there are exceptional circumstances.

Holidays are always 'unauthorised' and a Penalty Notice may be issued to each parent for each child taken out of school.

A Penalty Notice is an alternative to a prosecution through the court. It is a fine of **£60.00 per parent per child**, which increases to **£120.00 per parent per child** if not paid within 21 days. If the Penalty Notice remains unpaid after 28 days, this may result in legal action.

It is important that parents inform school about the reasons for all absences. If parents fail to do this and we are unable to locate children, this will be treated as a safeguarding concern and a referral may be made to the Children's Services.
