This month, we have been working very hard to prepare for our Eco Schools Green Flag re-assessment. The children on our Eco Committee have been making sure the grounds are spotless and that their knowledge on environment is brilliant. After a thorough inspection last week, we passed and the children achieved another green flag for our school. This means we will have held the green flag for ten years at our next renewal - the longest standing green flag school in Birmingham! As well as this, we have just been awarded a Community Education Award for Green Awareness, thanks to our Gardening Club and our Eco Committee. This award recognises the effort our school makes to teach our children about wildlife and the outdoors, as well as the children's commitment to caring for the nature. 780 schools entered this award and we won - well done everyone!
